Support for students with disabilities and learning difficulties

The KMU Akademie is committed to enabling students to realise their full potential. We are committed to ensuring that the programmes we offer are inclusive of all students, including students with disabilities and learning difficulties.

A person has a disability if they have a physical or mental impairment that has a substantial and long-term adverse effect on their ability to carry out normal day-to-day activities. However, like Middlesex University, the KMU Akademie recognises that a person is disadvantaged by social and environmental factors rather than by a disability itself.

Disability in this context can encompass a wide range of problems and conditions. Typically these include one or a combination of the following categories:

- Specific learning difficulties e.g. dyslexia
- Visual impairment impaired vision or blindness
- Hearing loss limited hearing or profound hearing loss
- Mobility difficulties or wheelchair users
- Restricted use of the upper limbs
- Mental health problems
- non-visible condition, e.g. epilepsy, sickle cell anaemia, HIV
- Condition not listed above (e.g. back injury)



The above list is not intended to be exhaustive. If a student feels that they have a medical condition that affects their ability to study successfully, they should contact the KMU Akademie Student Support Services as soon as possible. The KMU Akademie will treat information regarding the nature or existence of the disability as confidential.

Special and flexible assessment arrangements are permitted following a discussion with the student and the submission of appropriate medical evidence, or in the case of dyslexia or other specific learning difficulties, a report from an educational psychologist confirming the condition, on the recommendation of the Student Support Service.

Possible support services include ensuring the accessibility of teaching/assessment areas, providing learning materials in the appropriate format, allowing audio recording of feedback sessions and information on assistive technologies.
